PORGOTTEN PACTS OF OUR ANCIENT MEDICAL SCIENCES!



SSECTION Book Review:-The Emperor of All Maladles By: Siddharth Mukharjee

Siddharth Mukharjee is a well known cancer physician and researcher. He is assistant professor of medicine at Columbia University, USA and practices at CU/NYU Presbyterian Hospital. In "The Emperor of All Maladies", he examines cancer with a cellular biologist's precision, a historian's perspective and a biographer's passion. He has personified cancer and has attempted to enter the mind of this immortal illness, to understand its personality and to demystify its behaviour. The result is an astonishingly lucid and eloquent chronicle of a disease that humans have lived with and perished from for more than five thousand years. The story of cancer is not only a story of human ingenuity, resilience and perseverance but also of hubris arrogance and misperception.

The author, here by, recounts centuries of discoveries, setbacks, victories and deaths, told through the eves of predecessors and peers. Two characters who stand at the epicenter of this story are Sidney Faber, the Father of modern chemotherapy and Maru Lasker, a legendary entrepreneur, socialite and lobbyist, who helped to launch a national movement for initiating cancer research on large scale.

Finally, the book provides a fascinating glimpse into the future of cancer treatments and ends on a note of optimistic attitude towards control of cancers. The book was highly praised by critics and won "The Pulitzer Prize" for Non Fiction category, 2011.
